

SOME NEWS FROM MADAGASCAR: Talata Ampano and Faratsiho

They arrived on July 5, 2019 and stayed for four weeks.
Their project was to provide health animation and especially
to teach hygiene in some schools in the District.



On Tuesday, July 10, it was the turn of Saint Stanislas Kostka College to welcome them. They met the students level by level. Soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes were given out. Everyone had their share.

News from the Orphanage in Faratsiho

The Orphanage is still full, with 71 girls, with departures and arrivals during the year. They are from 20 years to 8 months old: little Annie was exceptionally welcomed on February 2, 2019, without a birth certificate, with her sister Florette aged 6 years old. She was only 3 months old and weighed only 1.5kg because her mother had a mental illness and her father had tuberculosis. He died of it before Easter.



It is true that Annie has specific needs and, of course, requires to be well cared for, but she is very lucky because she is now becoming very beautiful, a real doll, very awake. She is growing fast because she has gained weight and weighs more than 10kg!

We are well aware that the education of orphan girls is very complex. We must be careful to support them, encourage them so that they grow up to be "strong women"! They also need our testimony (Sisters, instructors, alumni who come to visit the orphanage, associated friends...), our benevolent presence.
